2. Did you know that **Sue Bird**, considered to be one of the greatest players in WNBA history, is Jewish?

3. Over half of the **attorneys active during the Civil Rights Movement** in the South **were Jewish**.

4. There was a **kosher kitchen on Ellis Island in 1911**, to serve the large waves of Jewish immigrants coming to America.

5. The bagel was brought to the United States by Jewish immigrants from Poland in the late 19th-century.

6. The words, "... give me your tired, your weak, huddled masses..." that are written on the **Statue of Liberty** come from a poem by **Emma Lazarus**, a Jewish writer and activist.

7. The creators of Superman, Jerry Siegel and Joe Shuster, were children of Jewish immigrants and wrote comics telling the story of Superman fighting Nazis, Adolf Hitler, and other aggressors in the 1940s. **8.** Levi Strauss, a Jewish immigrant from Germany, **invented blue jeans in 1873**.

9. Jewish basketball star **Ossie Schectman scored the first ever basket** in the first professional basketball game.

10. 18 Jews have been awarded the Medal of Honor, the greatest award given to American military service members for acts of valor.

11. Henry Moskowitz was a Jewish civil rights activist, and one of the **co-founders of the** National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP).

12. There are **131 Jewish American Nobel Prize Laureates**.

13. Maneschewitz, a brand of wine and other kosher products, was **founded in Cincinnati**, **Ohio in 1888**.

14. As of 2023, there are **10 Jewish Senators and 27 Jewish Members of the U.S. House of Representatives**.

15. Lazlo Biro, a Jewish Hungarian-Argentine inventor, created the modern ballpoint pen in response to the inconsistencies and struggles of using fountain pens.

16. Jewish scientist **Rosalyn Yalow developed** a **method called radioimmunoassay**,

allowing the measurement of tiny amounts of biological material in human blood. This led to numerous breakthroughs in medicine, including detection of type -1 diabetes, and other hormonal and endocrine diseases.

17. Touro Synagogue in Rhode Island, founded in 1763, was America's first Jewish house of worship.

18. There are seven Jewish players, coaches, and executives in the Pro Football Hall of Fame, including linebacker Andre Tippett, coach Marv Levy, and executive Al Davis.

19. One of the many reasons many Jewish Americans eat **Chinese food on Christmas** is that many Chinese dishes **conform to basic Jewish dietary rules**, due to their lack of dairy.

20. Jewish immigrants originally founded some major Hollywood studios, after facing discrimination in other entertainment industries. Many built on their experience in vaudeville theaters, which put on cheap performances in many different languages to cater to immigrant populations in New York.

21. Kosher dill pickles were a large part of the food culture among Jews in Eastern Europe, before becoming a staple item in the United States.

22. The "I <3 NY," logo was created
by Jewish American graphic designer
Milton Glaser, who was also responsible for
well known graphics such as Bob Dylan's
"Greatest Hits: 1975" poster, and many others.

23. Voice actor Mel Blanc, otherwise known as **"The Man of 1000 Voices,"** played Tweety Bird, Bugs Bunny, Daffy Duck, and many other iconic characters. He grew up in a Jewish household in San Francisco, and started his work in Vaudeville theaters. **24.** Marvin Hamlisch, a Jewish composer, pianist, and conductor, is **one of only 12 people to win the "EGOT."** This consists of winning an Emmy, Grammy, Oscar, and Tony Award. He also won two Golden Globes and a Pulitzer Prize for his work.

25. Yip Harburg, born to Eastern European Jewish immigrants, wrote the iconic song "Over the Rainbow."

26. Jewish scientist **Jonas Salk discovered the polio vaccine** in 1955.

27. Jewish Engineer **Joseph Strauss** was the **supervisor of the construction of the Golden Gate bridge** in San Francisco.

28. President Barack Obama held the first ever White House Seder in 2009, celebrating the Jewish holiday of Passover.

29. Half a million **Jewish American soldiers** fought in World War 2.

30. The first woman elected to a national office of a labor union was **Rose Schneiderman**, a Jewish immigrant from Poland.
